## DREDGER "LA LOIRE"

I am in receipt of your letter of the 7th. instant, with enclosure, regarding the above case and have called upon La Compagnie de Dragage et des Entreprises Maritimes, which Company is really the Paris Branch of the Tilbury Contracting and Dredging C°. It appears that this vessel was owned by The Tilbury Contracting and Dredging C° Ltd., who chartered her to the Société Anonyme des Chantiers Généraux of Cette, before transferring the management of her to their Paris house. Her charter does not expire until December/January next. I pointed out to the Manager of La Compagnie de Dragage that the Special Survey N° 2 is long overdue and that in order that the vessel's class may remain undisturbed, it would be necessary for the Society's Surveyor at Marseilles to hold a general examination of her. The Manager informed me that he would write to the Tilbury Contracting C° and ask them to make the necessary arrangements with the Charterers for this to be done and he suggested that it would be well if the matter were taken up


