D. I am in receipt of your letter of the 3rd instant, enclosing one from Messrs. John Bonthron & Son, of Anstruther, regarding the case of the Wooden Drifter "RENNYHILL" ex "Dyker Lassie" ex "Fogbank".

The circumstances referred to in Messrs. Bonthron's letter are not understood, and I am directed to request that you will be good enough to make arrangements to call on the firm with a view to ascertaining from them fully what they have in mind and report the result of your interview for the Committee's consideration.
