Dear Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 20th January last addressed to the Society's Surveyors at Aberdeen relative to the examination of the screw shaft of the steamer "MAGGIE GAULT", I beg to acquaint you that the Surveyors have forwarded to this Office the telegrams which have recently passed between them and your goodself in regard to the examination of the shaft.

The Committee much regret that owing to the shortness of notice given to the Surveyors in the matter, it was not possible for them to make arrangements to attend ~~at~~ at Lossiemouth to carry out the necessary survey.

As you are aware the survey of the shaft is now twelve months overdue, and in the circumstances the Committee have no option but to desire you to make definite arrangements to draw in the shaft for examination by the Society's Surveyors when the steamer is next placed in dry dock, and I have to add that if this is to take place at Lossiemouth, it will be necessary for a suitable notice to be given to the Society's Surveyors at Aberdeen with a view to their giving the case
