BLINK.—Washington, D.C., Feb. 25.—The Navy Department announced today that the Norwegian steamer Blink had been torpedoed by an enemy submarine off the Atlantic coast.—Exchange Telegraph Company.

BLINK.—Washington, D.C., Feb. 25.—Six survivors from the Norwegian steamer Blink told of a 66-hours lifeboat journey, during which 17 companions died. They said that three torpedoes struck the Blink, one killing three members of the crew in the engine-room. Four others who boarded a raft presumably perished, while the remaining 23 entered the only undamaged lifeboat.—Exchange Telegraph Company.
