Dear Sir,

S. I beg to acquaint you that the Committee of this Society have had under further consideration to-day the classification of your wood auxiliary motor vessels "MARIA BRIZZOLARI" and "PIETRO BRIZZOLARI", regarding which enquiries have been made of your goodself from time to time on the subject of the Special Surveys required by the Society's Rules.

The classification of these vessels has been allowed to remain undisturbed in the Society's Register Book up to the present on the condition that the vessels would be submitted for the necessary surveys by the Society's Surveyors before they were again sent to sea. It appears, however, that both vessels have been placed in commission and that no survey has been made of them by the Society's Surveyors, and in these circumstances the Committee regret that there is no alternative but to give instructions for their classes to be expunged from the Register Book with a red line, indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.

I have the pleasure to add that upon the receipt of a satisfactory report from the Society's Surveyors on the completion of the necessary surveys and repairs the cases
