

Dear Sirs,

With reference to the classification in the Society's Register Book of the steamer "MONT CERVIN", I beg to acquaint you that the Committee have had the case of this vessel before them as regards the Special Survey No. 2, which, I may remind you, became due in August last year.

The Society's Surveyor at Marseilles reports that the steamer is at present lying there, and that the survey is not at present being proceeded with.

In the circumstances I have the pleasure to say that the Committee will be agreeable to the steamer's class remaining undisturbed in the Society's Register Book for the present, subject to the conditions usually required in similar cases, viz:- that the survey be completed before the vessel is again sent to sea, and that you undertake to have this done if she remain your property, and should she be offered for sale, to inform intending purchasers that the class is allowed to remain subject to this being done, and to advise this Office of the name and address of the purchasers
