Dear Sir,

With reference to the classification in this Society's Register Book of the ferro-concrete vessel "MOLLIETTE" which appears to be now your property, I beg to remind you that this vessel became due for Special Annual Survey in June 1921. In January 1921 the Society's Surveyors at this port reported that the vessel had sustained damage to the starboard bilge through striking a dock entrance and that temporary repairs had been effected. These temporary repairs were further examined in January last and the Surveyors recommended that the vessel should be drydocked and permanently repaired before proceeding on another voyage under loaded conditions. It was also reported by the Surveyors that the machinery had been removed from the vessel as it was in a badly damaged condition. In the circumstances I shall be obliged if you will kindly let me know, for the information of the Committee, what arrangements you propose making to have the Special Annual Survey held and the necessary repairs to the hull and machinery carried out.
