Sir,

Reverting to my letter of the 1st May last and to previous correspondence respecting the watertight doors required to the openings in the bulkhead between the coal bunker and fore hold of the steamer "OPLAND", I have to acquaint you that I am now in receipt of a reply from the Society's Surveyor at Shanghai to my enquiries in the matter, but as it is still not clear that the doors in question are made properly watertight in accordance with the Committee's requirements it is considered they should be submitted for further examination by one of the Society's Surveyors at the earliest opportunity. I shall therefore feel obliged if you will kindly inform the Owners accordingly and ascertain from them at what port it will best suit their convenience to have the further examination made, in order that the Society's Local Surveyors may be furnished with the necessary instructions on the subject.
