Dear Sirs,

With reference to your letter of the 9th ultimo addressed to the Society's Surveyor at Lisbon, respecting the classification in this Society's Register Book of the steam trawlers belonging to your fleet, I am directed to acquaint you that the Committee have had under their consideration the cases of the "MARIA HELENA", "MARIA LEONOR" and "MARIA LUIZA II", which vessels are overdue for survey.

In the case of the "MARIA HELENA" and "MARIA LEONOR", the Special Surveys for which the vessels are overdue, have been partly held and the Committee regret to learn that you have declined to pay the fees for the inspections already carried out, and do not desire to continue the vessel's classification.

It is also noted that it is not your intention to submit the trawler "MARIE LUIZA II" to the Special Survey No. 3 which became due in July, 1919, and in the circumstances of these cases the Committee regret that they have had no alternative but to expunge the classes from the Register Book with a red line, indicating non-compliance with the Society's Rules.

In the case of the trawler "OITO DE SETEMBRO", the Committee have decided, in view of no survey being due, to withdraw the vessel's class and to insert three dots (...) in lieu thereof, indicating withdrawal of class at Owners' request.
