In reply to your letter respecting the lapwelded masts supplied by the Firm of Stewart & Lloyd Glasgow to the Dublin Dockyard Co for the new steamer "Streatham". I beg to state that my examination of these tube masts was more cursory than it would have ~~been~~<sup>been</sup> had I known that they were not examined by our Surveyors in Glasgow as I thought they would have been, as before - in another case, but the impression made on my mind was that they were a good job - in form, straightness & workmanship and I am pleased to hear the steel was tested. I might add that they would have perhaps been all the better of a good big pin being fitted through both neck flanges where they join - but I am

told this is not required as the makers  
subjected them to an end on test of  
a very considerable amount without  
any slipping or movement - this good  
result appears to have been obtained  
by careful shrinking & sizing - If it is  
thought necessary the accuracy of this  
statement & particulars of this test could  
be obtained by the Glasgow Surveyors  
from Mess Stewart & Lloyd Glasgow
