I regret omitting the thickness of the middle line  
intercostal plate, this is  $\frac{5}{8}$ " iron, in way of the  
Engine and Boiler space, and the thickness of the  
raised quarter deck plating, is  $\frac{3}{8}$  iron where exposed  
& .30 steel where not exposed.
