Reverting to your letter of the 30th ultimo enclosing one from Dr. Webster regarding the equipment of anchors and cables of the T.S.S. "CERAMIC", I have to acquaint you that Captain Noal, the Owners' Superintendent, called at this Office yesterday when the matter was fully discussed with him.

Captain Noal produced certificates of test issued by the Netherton Proving House at the time the vessel was built, and pointed out that this vessel is a passenger ship and the anchors and cables would, therefore, have been examined by the Board of Trade Surveyors annually since she was built.

In the circumstances, I am directed to state that provided the general particulars of the anchors and cables agree with the certificates of test, and the weights of the anchors and the length and size of the cables are in accordance with the requirements of the Society's Rules for the equipment number of this vessel, the equipment at present on board will be accepted without being retested.
