Dear Sir,

S. With reference to the classification in this Society's Register Book of the Wood schooners "BIANCA" and "MURIEL", I am directed to acquaint you that the Committee have had these cases under consideration to-day, together with a letter received from the Society's Seattle Surveyor, from which it appears that the vessels in question have recently become your property.

Mr. Hastie, the Surveyor in question, states that the necessary information regarding the Special Surveys for which these vessels are now considerably overdue, has been transmitted to you on several occasions, and that although he has been favoured with a personal interview, he has been unable to arrange for the vessels to be submitted to inspection.

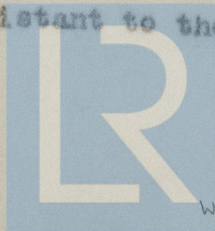
In the circumstances the Committee desire me to say that in view of the fact that in each instance the Special Survey, (both as regards hull and machinery in the case of the "MURIEL" and as regards hull in that of the "BIANCA") is now long overdue, they will have no alternative but to expunge the classes of the vessels from the Register Book unless arrangements are made for the inspections in question to be held forthwith.

In the meantime they have deferred action in the matter to allow time for the receipt of a reply from your good selves, failing which the classes of both vessels will be dealt with.
