Since writing you on the 12th instant, regarding the classification of the above vessels, I have received the promised reply from Signor Mazza, a copy of which letter is attached, together with a free translation made by Mr. Mantelli, from which you will observe that Mr. Mazza, is not able to reconsider his previous decision. -

I should like to draw your attention to the statement made by Mr. Mazza in his letter to Mr. Rippon, the extract from which reads as follows: -

"With pleasure will I meet the representative of Lloyd's Register, in your Office and would be only too glad to be able to please him, but I fear that I shall not be able to do so as it is not a question of the expenditure for the survey"....etc.

This you will observe is not the attitude now assumed by Sig. Mazza, but as far as we are concerned I am afraid the matter will now have to be dropped. -
