Dear Sir,

With reference to the Glasgow first entry reports Nos. 38862 and 39126 on Boilers built by Messrs. Babcock & Wilcox (Nos. 405 & 407) I have to inform you that these boilers have been fitted into the new Steamers "WAR SUCCOUR" (now named "ASTER") and "WAR RELIEF" (now named "POLLENZO") which vessels have been built at Haverton Hill-on-Tees by Messrs. The Furness Shipbuilding Co., Ltd.

An account has been rendered to the Ministry of Shipping for the fees due for the survey during construction of the Hull and Machinery of these vessels, and on payment your account will be credited with £36:7:4 for Boilers No. 405 and £36:4:6 for Boilers No. 407, these amounts being the proportion due in each case for the survey during construction at the makers' works.

I shall therefore be glad if you will kindly see that the necessary entries are now made in the Glasgow Rough Fee and Debit Books in the usual way.
