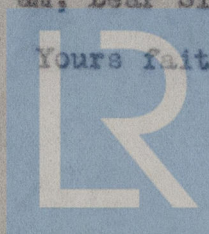
With reference to your letter of the 4th instant respecting the alterations now being effected to your steamers "GORACERO", "CORINALDO" and "CORRIENTES" in connexion with the carriage of chilled and frozen meat, I have the pleasure to acquaint you that the matter has been taken up with the Society's Glasgow Office, where the plans of the proposed additional deck etc. were dealt with, and has been carefully investigated, and it would appear that you have been somewhat under a misapprehension as to the purpose of the guarantee which you were asked to furnish in these cases.

When the plans were dealt with, you were requested to supply the guarantee usual in such instances, namely that chilled meat would not be suspended from the beams at the same time as general cargo was carried above. This guarantee, however, is only intended to apply to general cargo, and no objection will be taken to your proposal to carry frozen meat above the deck at the same time as chilled meat is suspended below.
