Sir,

I beg to acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 8th instant in regard to the alterations being carried out to the steamers "CORACERO", "CORINALDO" and "CORRIENTES" belonging to the Donaldson South American Line, Ltd., and in reply I am desired by Dr. Montgomerie to inform you that the Owners' representative appears to be under a misapprehension as to the procedure which took place in approving the plans ~~showing the~~ showing the alterations to the vessels mentioned in his letter.

The beams were approved on the understanding that no general cargo was carried on the deck above at the same time as chilled meat was suspended from below, this being in accordance with the uniform practice of the Committee. The proposal Mr. Livingstone desires to make is that frozen meat be carried above and chilled meat suspended from the same beams. There would be no objection to this as it has been approved in similar cases.
