Dear Sir,

We beg to forward herewith for the consideration of the Committee a letter, received from Messrs Scotts SB. & Eng. Co. Ltd., regarding the classification fees which have been rendered for their S.S. No.482, "CORINALDO", built for Messrs Donaldson Bros. Ltd., which was completed on the 10th instant.

These fees have been charged on the new scale which came into force on the 1st January, 1921. and are as follows:- First Entry £10:0:0; Special Survey £378:5:6. On the old scale the fees would have been First Entry £5:0:0; Special Survey £193:8:6.

The fee for the Freeboard, which was assigned in 1920, has been charged on the old basis.

With reference to the Builder's letter, we may say that, but for the Insulation, the Hull of the vessel might easily have been completed before the end of 1920.

With regard to the Machinery, the fees charged are First Entry £6:0:0; Special Survey £111:16:0; and on the old scale they would have been First Entry £3:0:0; Special Survey £56:16:0.

The Machinery would not have been completed before the end of last year, as the steam pipes were not completely tested

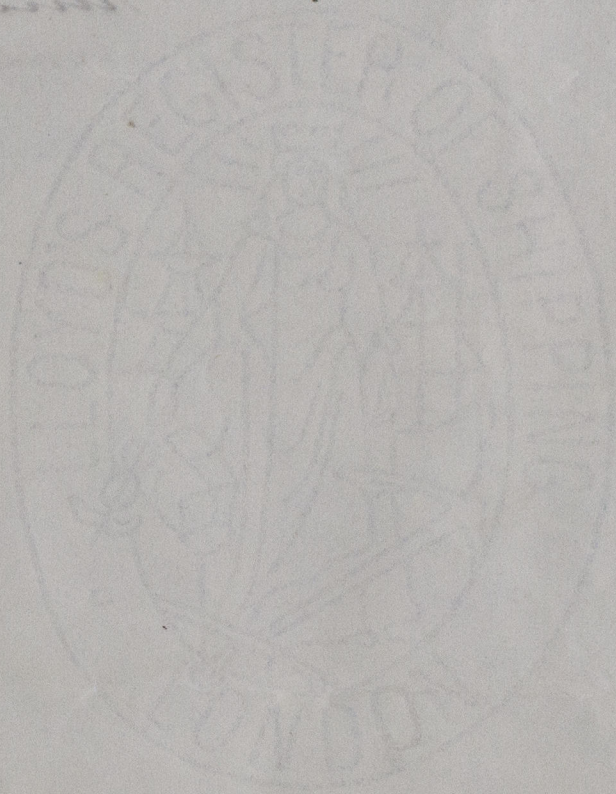
