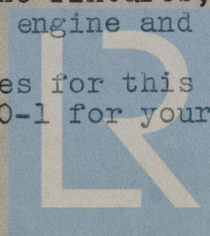
We have for acknowledgment copies of the following letters as referred to us by your Baltimore Surveyor, Mr. C. Hastie:-

1. Lloyd's Register of Shipping, London, letter dated February 16, 1938.
2. Lloyd's Register of Shipping, New York, letter dated February 25, 1938.

In reference to the above-mentioned letters, we wish to advise that in fitting the emergency lighting circuit to the main switchboard on this ship, it is our purpose to establish a small number of emergency lights in the engine room and boiler room, at strategic points, in order to provide illumination to carry on the necessary operations in connection with the working of the ship in the event that the main generator circuit breakers open. We feel that this arrangement may be considered in a manner similar to the fitting of illuminating lamps on the switchboard proper, and that to maintain lighting under all conditions at such points as the control station, the firing station, etc., is of primary importance to the safe operation of the ship.

It is our practice to plainly mark 220 volt emergency lighting circuits at the fixtures, and under no conditions are the wires led out of the engine and boiler spaces.

Fuse and cable sizes for this ship will be forwarded later on our drawing #4327-20-1 for your approval.
