Nature of Survey

Classification

This vessel was built in 1906, but not classed with this Society.

Plans & a First Entry Report have been examined with a view to classing the vessel in the Society's Register Book, and found that they were such as she could be recommended to the Committee for the class Al, Coasting, England, Wales & French Channel Ports".

The requirements for the S.S.No.3 have also been complied with, except that the whole of the ceiling has not been lifted as required by the Rules. The Surveyors, however, state that sufficient ceiling was lifted by them to make a thorough examination.

It is submitted the vessel be classed Al "Coasting, England, Wales, & French Channel Ports", with record of survey 4. 18, and notation of S.S.Cff. No.3, 4. 18.


