the undersigned Surveyor to this Society did at the request of the Owners, MESSRS THE SHAW SAVILL AND ALBION CO. LTD., Wellington attend on board the S.S. "MAHIA" 8822 tons gross of Southampton on the 2nd. March, 1953 and subsequently as the vessel lay afloat at Wellington for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of the damage stated to have been caused when discharging cargo. It was stated that a boiler dropped onto the deck of the "Mahia" from a height of approximately ten feet.

For further particulars please see vessel's log books.

UPON EXAMINATION FOUND

Starb. side abreast of No. 2 Hatch indented, maximum 3", area affected 12ft. x 4 ft.

Four deck beams Nos. 139, 140, 141 and 142 buckled.

Thermometer pipe deck fitting and pad broken away from deck plating.

Five off refrigerated hatch beams buckled in various places.

One section of portable hand rail (Starb. Side) buckled and broken.

All new and disturbed work to be replaced in good order and given two coats of approved paint.

The above recommendations have been made with a view to placing the vessel in the same efficient condition as before the damage was sustained.
