(Except for storage). (Sailing Commencing not later than Midnight, December 12th, 1942).

NOTE:—When from any cause whatsoever the vessel is rendered unseaworthy or otherwise unfit for the carriage and/or storage of grain, this approval will be withdrawn without notice. Owner to apply for re-inspection when vessel has been repaired or reconditioned and new certificate will be issued upon surveyors approval.
