A. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 13th instant, respecting the claim which has been forwarded to you for £17 in respect of the survey during construction of the machinery of the S.S. "DUNDRUM CASTLE", Messrs. Harland & Wolff's No.572 vessel, and in reply to your enquiry I have to inform you that the machinery of this vessel was formerly Messrs. Harland & Wolff's Contract No.572 and was finished by Messrs. J. G. Kincaid & Co., when they took over the Arthur Street Works in January, 1919, and the machinery then became known as Messrs. Kincaid & Co's No.572, which no doubt accounts for the fact of the difference of the name of the Builders in your records.
