Dear Mr. Clement:

I duly received your letter of the 12th ultimo advising the arrival of Jacksonville Reports No. 936 on the Yacht "MOANA" ex "STRANGER", and your remarks regarding the financial side of this case have been carefully noted.

With regard to the additional charges amounting to \$1050. which appeared in Mr. Boyle's accounts for the March and June quarters, 1938, I am informed that these fees were for services rendered by Mr. Boyle in a consultant capacity regarding the Reclassification Survey prior to its being started. I understand that Mr. Boyle was able to effect a considerable saving to Mr. Leeds, the Owner of the yacht, in the cost of the repairs, and he apparently regarded these fees as coming within the scope of his account with the Society. However, no report was prepared for this part of the work.
