With reference to Messrs. Cockerill's yard No. 67 we beg to submit for the consideration of the Committee a plan shewing the details of the flat plate keel and centre girder.

It will be observed from the detail sketches that one rivet is shewn in the keel seam to the ordinary bottom frame with the next rivet in the keel close to the jogged.

The Builders think this a good arrangement and have adopted the same in their 654-5 & 6 ships. Two rivets in the frame are being fitted in all the rest of the shell seams.

We shall be glad to learn that this arrangement is in order. The plan referred to is being forwarded in triplicate under separate cover. In my opinion, the arrangement merits favourable consideration.
