Précis of particulars of Casualty Struck mine when leaving Port Said

about 14th May, 1942. After beaching it was found she had a hole about 50ft. long; there were cracks across the deck and down both sides.

She became flooded throughout and gradually sank into the sand.

Owing to her exposed position, vulnerability, and nature and extent of damage, salvage was not undertaken and the vessel was abandoned.

The bunker oil caught fire about the end of June and there were five subsequent fires.

Refloating is impracticable and the Port Said Surveyor has stated that all equipment is being removed as opportunity offers.
