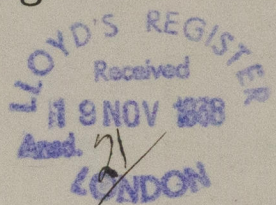

Dear Sir,

We have to thank you for your letter "M" of the 15th instant, together with copies of letters as advised therein, regarding the approval of the plan of Forward Deep Tank for Messrs. Swan, Hunter & Wigham Richardson's Yard No.1567.

The question of welding the frame brackets to the tank top plating in the forward deep tank has been discussed with the Builders, when the remarks contained in your letter were brought to their notice.

After some consideration of the matter, the Builders have now arranged to omit the floor top angles in way of the frame brackets and to weld the floors direct to the tank top plating. The floor top angle will be stopped at the toe of the bracket, from which point the heel of the angle will be welded for a length of 9".
