
With reference to Mr. Graham's letter of the 21st instant submitting for the consideration of the Committee plans of the boilers and pumping arrangements of the S.S. "HERTFORD" ex "Friesland", I have to acquaint you that the scantlings of the boilers as shown on the plan meet the requirements of the Rules in force at the time the boilers were constructed for the original working pressure of 199 lb. per sq. inch, and the pumping arrangements are also in order.

The plans forwarded are returned herewith, and with regard thereto I am directed to inform you that provided the requirements contained in my letters referring to the sister vessels "HORFOLK" & "CUMBERLAND" dated 1st ultimo and 8th instant respectively, be complied with, the machinery of this vessel will be accepted for the original working pressure of 199 lb. per square inch and a record of LME (with date) without the distinguishing mark assigned.
