Dear Sirs,

With reference to Mr. Sturgeon's letter of the 22nd instant submitting for the consideration of the Committee plans of the main boilers and pumping arrangements of the Ex-German Steamer "WINDLAND" built in 1919 under the supervision of the Surveyors to the Germanischer Lloyd and now under survey at your Port with a view to classification with this Society, I have to acquaint you that, provided the working parts of the engines be opened out, examined, and be found in good order and safe working condition and in accordance with the Rules; the shafting be found sound and free from defects; the boilers be examined throughout, their scantlings be in accordance with the plan and be in good order and safe working condition; the pumping arrangements be as shown on the plan and otherwise in accordance with the requirements of the Rules, the machinery of this vessel will be accepted for the original working pressure of 205 lbs per square inch, and a notation of LMC (with date) without the distinguishing mark to be assigned.
