INAKI.—Vigo, Oct. 1.—A British seaman is among nine survivors who have been landed here from the steamer Inate (? Inaki) sunk by bombs on Tuesday (Sept. 29), 35 miles north of Cape Finisterre, while proceeding from Lisbon to Eire. The Inate (? Inaki), flying the Panamanian flag, was carrying a cargo of foodstuffs. It is believed that other members of the crew, who were in the second in command, have been picked up and taken to Atlantic ports. Reuter.
