My dear Dick,

The case of the "INGERTO", which went forward to-day, and the Glasgow Report on which has been forwarded under separate cover, presented some difficulties.

In accordance with your instructions, a General Examination has been carried out here, but we were unable to complete the Special Survey by the examination of the side bunkers, as these were full of coal.

After explaining the case fully to the Committee, they assigned a record of S.S. Gls. No. 2,42, subject to the side bunkers being examined.

I don't think you can do anything with the L.M.C. record, which has accordingly been left as recommended by the Bergen Surveyor, and as no port of survey is associated with this record, I do not think it matters.

I trust that the Committee have taken the right action in this rather complicated case, and perhaps you will kindly let me know if this is so.

As the Special Survey fees would appear to have been paid at Bergen, I conclude no charge should be made for the General Examination held here.
