Dear Sirs,

I duly received your letter of the 23rd instant enclosing one from the Ellerman & Papayanni Lines Ltd., regarding the ex Polish steamer "WILJA" for which the Society's Classification is sought.

I may say that in order to entitle this vessel to the Society's class it will be necessary for the requirements of a Second Special Survey No.3 to be complied with, and in addition particulars of the scantlings, equipment etc. should be reported on a First Entry Report form.

In the event of the survey not being completed at your port, the vessel should be Generally Examined in accordance with the instructions set forth in Circular No.1764, and she should be placed in a satisfactory condition for a period of six months with a view to an assignment of "LOCAL class contemplated, examined (with date)".

I may say that the question of fees will be decided when the particulars of tonnage etc. are known.

As regards the freeboard I enclose a copy of a letter which was sent to the Liverpool office recently when it was understood that the survey for classification would be dealt with there.

In connection with this case the following telegram has been sent you today namely:-

"WILJA INSTRUCTIONS SENT LIVERPOOL TENTH INSTANT WITH WHOM COMMUNICATE".
