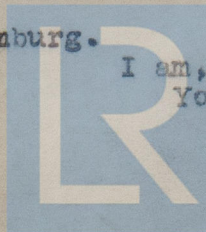
With reference to your letter of the 7th instant regarding the Steamer "MELISKERK" ex "CESARIO", I have to acquaint you that no fees have been charged up to the present for the classification survey of this vessel.

You should accordingly render an account to the Owners for a suitable fee to cover the survey of alterations effected at your port and for the survey of the Refrigerating Machinery, in addition to a fee of say £100 for the Hull and £35 for the Machinery, these amounts representing about 60% of the special survey fee that would have been charged had the hull and machinery been built under survey. The Rule fee of £11 for freeboard assignment has not yet been applied for, and should be an additional item of your account.

As you are aware the balance of the classification work in this case was done at Hull, and the Society's Surveyors at that port will be credited with the fees not chargeable on account of the work done at Hamburg.
