With reference to the Condition Surveys desired by the Ministry of Shipping in the cases of ex-German Steamers being taken over by the British Government, I have to acquaint you that it appears from communications received from the Ministry of Shipping that the under-mentioned steamers have left Germany for the Firth of Forth, and I have to request that you will give the cases the necessary attention on arrival.
