In reply to your letter of the 10th instant in regard to Greenock First Entry Report No. 21415 on the Steamer "MICHAEL E", I beg to acquaint you that the Surveyor states that 45 fathoms of chain cable were not delivered in time to be put on board before the vessel sailed.

These are now in the shipyard of Messrs. Wm. Hamilton & Co., Ltd. and arrangements had been made with the Owners that they would be put on board at the first opportunity, but information has since come to hand that the vessel has been torpedoed and sunk.
