Plate No.1 in upper deck sheerstrake, Port and Starboard, buckled at fore end.

Hawse Pipe flange inside shell fractured on port and starboard sides.

RECOMMENDED.

About twelve ft. of Stem Bar to be cropped, removed, faired and refitted, butts to be electrically welded. Plates No.1 in first strake above upper deck sheerstrake and in first strake below upper deck sheerstrake to be cropped on port side and removed for access to welding of stem butts.

Plate No.1 on Port Side to be cropped, removed, faired and refitted. Plate No.1 on Starboard side to be removed, faired and refitted. Outside doubling, port and starboard, to be released at fore end for access to Plate No. 1.

Hawse pipe to be renewed.

All new and disturbed work to be coated. Repairs to shell plating to be hose tested on completion.
