"NURMAHAL" of London, 5419 tons gross, whilst afloat at Port Natal, on the 23rd September, 1942, and subsequently, for the purpose of ascertaining the nature and extent of the damage, stated to have been sustained in the Arabian Sea during a monsoon from the 23rd to 25th July, 1942.

On examination the undersigned found the following damage and made recommendations for repairs as under:-

| 1. Steam and exhaust pipes on Port side at No. 1 hatch distorted. | To be faired. |
| 2. Pipe casing and brackets buckled and fractured at Nos. 1 and 2 hatches. | Casing to be faired and brackets renewed. |
| 3. 3 hold ventilators fore deck washed overboard. | To be renewed. |
| 4. Welding on grab rails of 2 lifeboats fractured. | To be re-welded. |
| 5. One lifeboat shell plating fractured about 1' 6". | Welded covering plate to fit. |
| 6. The shell plating of above 3 lifeboats slightly indented on Starboard sides. | To be faired. |

The above repairs have been efficiently carried out.
