Dear Sirs,

I am in receipt of your letter of the 22nd instant
S. respecting the ex-German Steamer "MINNA HORN", and with
regard thereto I have to say that in reply to inquiry the
Ministry state that the sale of this vessel to Messrs.
The Byron Steamship Co. Ltd., has been definitely completed.
I therefore telegraphed to you as follows, which I now
confirm, viz:-

"MINNA HORN MINISTRY STATE VESSEL DEFINITELY
"TRANSFERRED TO BYRON COMPANY YOU ARE THEREFORE IN
"ORDER PROCEEDING WITH SIX-MONTHLY SURVEY".

A message was subsequently received from the new
Owners, intimating that they had decided to put the Steamer
through complete classification survey now instead of the
general examination for a six-monthly certificate, and I
therefore telegraphed to you again as follows, viz:-

"MINNA HORN OWNERS DESIRE CARRY OUT CLASSIFICATION
"SURVEY NOW INSTEAD OF SIXMONTHLY EXAMINATION COMPLY".

In the circumstances, I have to request that you
will give the case the necessary attention, and plans of
hull and boilers should be forwarded to this Office for
consideration as soon as possible; if not available, details
of the scantlings of hull and machinery should be ascertained
