ALLAN JACKSON.—Washington, Jan. 20.—The Navy Department states that the tankers COIMBRA and Allan Jackson have been sunk by submarine off the east coast of North America.

New York, Jan. 20.—Survivors who have reached an American port state that the tanker Allan Jackson was torpedoed amidsthips off the Atlantic Coast and sank within five minutes. Twenty-two of the crew perished but 13 managed to survive, six of whom are now in hospital with serious injuries, including the master and the second and third mates.—British United Press.
