A Former Newcastle Steamer

The Board of Admiralty regrets to announce that H.M.S. *Queenworth*, an auxiliary vessel of the Royal Navy (Lieutenant-Commander R. W. Wainwright, R.N.), has been sunk. The next of kin of casualties have been informed.

The *Queenworth*, a vessel of 2047 tons gross, was formerly owned by the Watergate Steam Shipping Company, Ltd., Newcastle. She was built at Sunderland in 1924. **TIMES 23/5**
