Dear Mr. Dalglish,

S.S. "QUEENWORTH".

I am favoured with your letter of the 1st instant, and carefully note what you say.

I need hardly assure you that the Committee fully recognise you as a most valuable client of the Society, but the Chairman, to whom I have shown your letter today, desires me to say, with all respect, that he is afraid you have not yet quite grasped our difficulty in the matter.

If a vessel is not completed within six months of the date of launch, then the date of build is fixed as six months from the date of launch, but if the vessel is completed within six months of the date of launch, then the date of completion is taken as the date of build.

Our difficulty in the case of the "QUEENWORTH" is this - How can we decline to recognise the fact that the vessel was (within six months of the date of launch) a completed and registered ship?

The Chairman will, however, bring the subject before the General Committee at their Meeting tomorrow, in accordance with your wishes, and I shall have the pleasure of
