Dear Dr. Montgomerie,

I think it best to return to you the correspondence you kindly passed to me with reference to the date of build of the "QUEENWORTH".

I am not quite sure how far you are posted up-to-date in this matter, but I may say that Mr. Scott, at the Chairman's suggestion, wrote to Mr. Dalgliesh two or three days ago to say that the Chairman would be very pleased if he would call in here and have a chat with him when he was next in London.

Mr. Howard Glover had a letter from Mr. Dalgliesh on the subject two days ago, to which an acknowledgment was sent. Mr. Glover had a further letter on the subject from Sir James Marr, and after taking counsel with Sir Thomas Storey and the Chairman he replied at some length yesterday or the day before, explaining fully the terms of the Rule and the general circumstances.

Today we had a reply from Mr. Dalgliesh, in which he adheres to the attitude he has taken in the matter. What reply, if any, will be sent to this, I do not know, but

the whole question was under discussion again between the two Chairs and the Secretary.
