I am in receipt of your letter of the 13th instant forwarding one from Messrs. R.S. Dalgliesh, Ltd. relating to the date of build to be recorded in the case of the new steamer "QUEENSWORTH", (Sunderland report No. 28939).

In reply, I have to request that you will be good enough to point out to the Owners that the first entry reports on this vessel were received here on the 25th October with a last date of survey, 17th October, 1924. The vessel was at that time reported as complete and eligible for the class recommended, viz:- #100A1.

In the circumstances the reports were submitted to the Committee on the 28th October, the vessel's class assigned and the first entry certificates issued, and the full particulars of the vessel's classification have since been entered in the Register Book with a date of build, October, 1924, as provided for in the Rules.

The Committee would be very pleased to meet the Owners' wishes in the matter of the date of build, but in the circumstances above described, they do not see how any modification of the date of build can now be agreed to consistently
