Visited vessel at request of Owner's representative for examination of No. 1 D.B. tank after discharge of cargo. It was stated that this tank could not be sounded during the voyage from New York to Glasgow, owing to the sounding pipe being frozen & that the Chief Engineer had reported, that, from indications during pumping operations, the tank had appeared to have made some water. It was also stated that temporary repairs had been effected in way of this tank at New York in 1, 43, on account of heavy weather on 21st to 31st December 1942 & an Interim Certificate, dated 11/1/43, continuing class subject to permanent repairs to shell plating in way of No. 1 D.B. tank at the first convenient opportunity, was issued.
ONE:- No. 1 D.B. tank examined internally (pos) with vessel afloat, & found to be making no water.

General Observations, Opinion as to Class, Recommendation, &c.:-

State clearly whether any and, if so, what alteration is suggested to be made in the existing classification and notification of the vessel in the Register Book consequent upon survey, thus, for example:- "to remain as classed in the Register Book without fresh record of Survey," "to remain as classed and to have record of survey, 1, 38," or "to remain as classed and to have record of survey, 1, 38, and the notations of ss No. 1-38."

This vessel, as far as now seen, is in an efficient condition & eligible in my opinion to remain as at present classed in the Register Book, without fresh record of survey, to permanent repairs to shell plating in way of No. 1 D.B. tank (pos) being carried out at the first convenient opportunity, also to indented plate (ps) in way of F.P. bulkhead & plates B4 (ps) and J6 & 8 from aft (ss) being dealt with, as to buckled bow & deck plating & screen bulkhead at aft end of No. 3 hatch in bridge 'tween deck at the first opportunity, & to rudder plates, rudder post & sternframe (E.W. 8, 42) being specially examined at next drydocking.
