The 3rd Special Survey No.1, due 12,38 has been partly held and a General Examination for postponement of the Survey to sometime within the year of grace was carried out at Rotterdam in May last.

To complete the Survey all the Rule requirements remain to be carried out except examination of bottom and rudder, weather decks and hatchways.

In reply to enquiry the Rotterdam Surveyors now write that they are informed by the Owners that this ship has been sold for breaking up purposes and it is expected this will shortly commence.

The year of grace expired last month.

It is submitted the notation "To be broken up" be inserted in the Register Book and the Rotterdam Surveyors requested to inform this Office when the work of demolition commences.
