done Shell plate 6" from foreward in the 4th stabe below sheer found indented and fractured. A doubling plate 24" x 24" has been fitted, secured by countersunk bolts. the plate jointed with Vulcan cement, and the edges caulked.

It is considered that this temporary repair will be effective during the coming voyage, but recommended that the doubling plate be secured either welding or riveting when the cargo is discharged. Cont.
