works on the 24th August, 1933, and subsequently, for the purpose
of examining and testing two 10" diameter throttle valves
intended for the s.s. "ZUIDERKERK" and s.s. "SEROOSKERK".

These valve chests are of cast steel made at works approved
by the Committee, and tested as required by the Rules.

They have now been examined under a hydraulic test pressure
of 350 lbs. per square inch, and found tight and sound.

The castings were examined after machining and, as far as
can be seen, are free from defects.

For the purpose of identification they have been stamped
on one flange and on cover thus:-
