E. I duly received your letter of the 7th instant with accompanying copies of Drawings Nos. 14600 and 14607 of the spring plates ordered by you from Messrs. William Jessop & Sons, Ltd., of Sheffield in connection with the 4,000 S.H.P. Turbine Machinery for Messrs. The British Thomson-Houston Co., Ltd.

It is noted that these spring plates are intended to form an elastic medium between the bearing housings and the gear case, and that they will have an approximate tensile strength of 60 tons per square inch. In this instance no tests will be required at the Makers' Works, but the plates will be examined on delivery at your own Works.
