Dear Sirs,

A. I beg to acknowledge the receipt of your telegram of today's date reading as follows:-

"Blackie New Waterway's urgently requiring
"certificates first 4000 SHP set please forward"

It is concluded that this refers to the Turbines for Messrs. The New Waterway Shipbuilding Co's No. 110 vessel and with regard thereto I think it well to point out that if the certificate to which you refer is the classification certificate of the machinery this cannot be issued until the completed reports on the vessel and machinery are received from the Society's Surveyors at Rotterdam, and these have not yet come to hand.

Mr. Blackie, the Surveyor who examined the work in progress on the turbines at your Shop during construction could, however, furnish a special certificate covering his examination, and if this is what you require I shall be glad to furnish you with such a document on hearing from you to this effect.

If the matter is very urgent perhaps you will kindly telegraph me on Monday morning.
