In the case of the S.S. "**FELICIANA**", Messrs. The Furness Shipbuilding Co's Yard No. 17, Middlesbrough Report No. 11282, a mistake has occurred in the fees charged at this Port.

The total fees chargeable as per your letter of the 25th. July 1921, addressed to the Glasgow Surveyors, should be

First Entry Fee..... £6:0:0 ✓


Survey Fees..... £125:5:0 ✓

£35 of this amount was debited at Glasgow against Messrs. J. Brown & Co, which left a balance of £96:5/- to be collected at this Port.

Accounts for £100:16:0 were debited against and paid by Messrs. Richardsons Westgarth & Co. Limited, this being £4:11:0 in excess of the fees due.

In the case of the sister vessel, S.S. "**LONDON MERCHANT**", Middlesbrough Report No. 11598, the correct fees were charged and paid.

Messrs. Richardsons Westgarth & Co, are aware of the overcharge and have suggested that the fees on the S.S. "**LONDON SHIPPER**", Messrs. Furness Shipbuilding Co's Yard No. 20, which is a sister vessel and nearing completion, might be

reduced when rendered, by the amount of the overcharge.

I shall be glad to be advised as to whether this suggestion meets with the Committee's approval, or as to whether a refund of the amount overcharged should be made from the Petty Cash.
